Scan for more information: Windlesham Parish Council Website In order to support residents in making an informed representation as part of the Surrey Heath Borough Council consultation, this leaflet has been prepared to offer further detail and clarification on the proposed options and how to have your say.

## What is happening?

Surrey Heath Borough Council (SHBC) has completed the first phase of a Community Governance Review (CGR), which looks at whether parish boundaries and councils still meet community needs.

Following this consultation, SHBC agreed on 22 October 2025 to begin a second phase focused on Windlesham Parish. This will assess if current arrangements reflect local identity and provide effective, convenient governance.

This review takes place in light of Local Government Reorganisation (LGR) - a major driver for change that is fundamentally altering how local services are delivered and how communities are represented.

#### **Results & Recommendations from Phase 1**

- Phase 1 Consultation Results:
  - Of an electorate of 13,636 residents, 607 responses were received (429 Windlesham, 97 Bagshot, 65 Lightwater). Of these:
  - o 292 respondents requested separate village councils (2.14% of electorate).
- SHBC Officer Recommendations from Phase 1:
  - o No changes to external boundaries.
  - o Merge Windlesham North and South into a single ward.
  - Further consultation on councillor numbers and governance improvements.

At the Surrey Heath Borough Council meeting held on 22nd October 2025, a motion was passed to reunite Windlesham North and South wards into a single ward as from the elections in May 2027, and to consult residents on the following questions:

#### Phase 2: Questions for residents

Q1:Do Windlesham Village residents wish to remain with the current combined arrangements, or separate from Bagshot and Lightwater to establish their own Parish Council?

In the event that the above generates a low response rate, or a strong majority is not in favour of change, the proposals will progress no further.

Q2: ONLY IF WINDLESHAM VILLAGE RESIDENTS SUPPORT CHANGE.

Do residents in Bagshot and Lightwater wish to move to 2 separate parishes, or stay combined as Bagshot and Lightwater?

Q3: Do residents want to alter the number of parish councillors representing each of the wards?

In the event of a resident's decision to maintain the status quo, the existing Parish Council is to be advised to review its governance arrangements with a view to addressing issues raised in the consultation. However it should be noted that SHBC can only advise as the Parish Council is an independent legal entity.

Indicative baseline costs for new village councils have been identified for guidance only. Final budgets and council tax rates will be set by the new councils.

Creating separate councils will involve some duplication of costs, and actual spending may exceed estimates

Note: Residents should be aware that, due to the ongoing local government reorganisation in Surrey, these projected figures do not include potential asset transfers, which could substantially increase the precept.

# Does Windlesham Parish Council provide value for money?

Windlesham Parish Council provides a range of services and holds assets, which, after adjusting for high-volume items, results in an amenities-per-pound ratio of 0.81. This can be compared to the provision levels of other parish councils in the area.
