We are pleased to inform residents that an area of Windlesham Cemetery has recently been landscaped to accommodate additional half-plot burials. This work ensures we can continue to provide a peaceful and well-maintained resting place for our community.

The Windlesham Village Committee has also agreed to plant a Liquidambar tree within the cemetery grounds. Known for its stunning autumn foliage, the Liquidambar displays vibrant red, orange, and purple leaves, adding beauty and seasonal interest to the area.





Windlesham Parish Council - how is your money spent?



What is the O

The parish precept is the portion of your council tax that funds the work of the parish council. It helps provide essential local services, maintain facilities, and support community initiatives.

What Does the Precept Fund?

The precept enables Windlesham Parish Council to provide a range of services including: parks and open spaces, allotments, cemeteries & heritage assets, tree management in our greenspaces areas, community grants and events in the villages.

The 25-26 WPC portion of your council tax ranges from 84p to £2.51 per week depending on your property banding.



In n 2025-26 there are 8,911 precepting parishes in England.

The average Band D precept charged by local precepting bodies (including parish & town councils) for 2025-26 is £92.22.

WPC's agreed precept level for 25-26 has increased by 8.27% compared to the previous year, resulting in a total precept of £65.29 for a Band D property. For the second year the Council has agreed a balanced budget meaning that the net expenditure for the Parish is covered by income raised by the precept.

EASTER NEST CAKES





With Easter just around the corner, there's no better time to whip up a batch of these delightful Easter Nest Cakes! Simple, fun, and perfect for getting little hands involved, these nobake treats combine crunchy cereal with smooth chocolate, topped with mini eggs for the perfect finish. Whether you're hosting an Easter gathering or just fancy a sweet treat, these nests are sure to bring a smile.

Ingredients

- 225g dark chocolate or a mix of dark and milk chocolate, broken into pieces
- 2 tbsp golden syrup
- 50g butter
- 75g cornflakes or puffed rice cereal
- 36 mini chocolate eggs

Method

- 1. Line a 12-hole fairy cake tin with paper cases.
- 2. Melt the chocolate, golden syrup and butter in a bowl set over a saucepan of gently simmering water (do not let the base of the bowl touch the water). Stir the mixture until smooth.
- 3. Remove the bowl from the heat and gently stir in the cornflakes until all of the cereal is coated in the chocolate.
- 4. Divide the mixture between the paper cases and press 3 chocolate eggs into the centre of each nest. Chill in the fridge for 1 hour, or until completely set.

Tips

- If you're not a fan of dark chocolate, you can substitute it with milk chocolate or a mix of both. Keep in mind that milk chocolate is much sweeter, and when combined with sugary cereal and golden syrup, it may become overly sweet.
- Feel free to swap cornflakes for shredded wheat or puffed rice cereal.
- Store your Easter egg cakes in an airtight container for up to a week to keep them fresh.
- Mini eggs can pose a choking hazard for young children. If needed, place them in a food bag and crush them into smaller pieces using a rolling pin.
