

VE & VJ day flags proudly on display across our 3 villages

We're proud to have supported the display of Union Jack flags across Windlesham and Lightwater, and to have awarded a grant to Bagshot Events for their commemorative flag displays. These flags honour both VE Day and VJ Day, and will remain in place through to the end of August, marking VJ Day – Victory over Japan Day, the date that signified the true end of the Second World War.


