	<ol> <li>The Committee believes that condition 31, installation of a cycle path cannot be met. The proposed alternative mitigation is not suitable. The Committee felt that upgrading or refurbishment of existing informal crossings is the responsibility of highways and cannot be a mitigation. It is understood that the developer met with stakeholder and the developer indicated that they were happy to provide a zebra crossing. This Committee would support the installation of a zebra crossing if practical and would like this investigated.</li> <li>The Committee supported the concerns raised by Natural England regarding noise and pollution.</li> <li>The Committee expressed particular concerns on the point raised by Natural England regarding the legal issue of money for service charges, the enforcement, and how any shortfall will be met. It was noted that the same developer provided a SANGS in Bagshot and asked residents to maintain it. This issue is still unresolved, therefore this Committee does not support a residents maintained SANGS.</li> <li>The developers report does not demonstrate how there will be an improvement in sustainable travel. In particular there is no mention how they will increase bus services.</li> <li>The Committee noted that there is no mention of all houses having EV points and indicated that there should be compliance with the standard</li> </ol>
